Regular Income- Income limit for individuals eligible for Low Income, and non-CCDF funds.

Transitional Child Care – Income limit for individuals who have had their TANF (Temporary Assistance For Needy Families) denied due to employment, or time limit expirations within the allowable timeframe.

Extended Year- Once in the CCA program, the parent can have a 1-year extension of services if the income does not exceed the 85% SMI guideline.

Children W/Disability – Families may qualify for this income limit if they have a child with a documented disability.

* These income figures exceed 85% of the State Median Income (SMI) for a family of the same size. Families at this level are not eligible for CCDF child care.
