### ChildCareGroup (CCG) Child Development Centers

We operate six model child development centers, serving nearly 600 infants, toddlers, and preschoolers for little or no cost to their families. Located in East and South Dallas, Oak Cliff, Irving, and Garland, our centers are funded by United Way of Metropolitan Dallas, Head Start of Greater Dallas, Early Head Start, parent fees, and private donations.



*Our child to caregiver ratios are kept low and curriculum is based on each child's individual needs.*

### Resource and Referral (R&R)

This program offers families looking for child care individualized referrals from a comprehensive database of more than 5,000 licensed child care facilities and registered family child care homes in 42 counties. R&R Specialists consult with parents to offer education on choosing the most appropriate child care for their family.

### Child Care Assistance (CCA)

Annually, this program subsidizes the cost of child care for nearly 25,000 children from low-income families. Funding is provided through WorkSource for Dallas County.

### Food and Nutrition


Children enrolled in our child development centers and contracted licensed and registered family child care homes receive two-thirds of their recommended nutritional daily allowances through funds from the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

### Relationship-Centered Child Care® (RC<sup>3</sup>®),

our nationally recognized model of care, is practiced in every ChildCareGroup Center. In this model, mixed-aged groups of children are cared for in a home-like environment by a constant caregiver for up to three years. We partner with large systems of care to install RC<sup>3</sup>® in their programs.
